Shine A Light

During last week's chapel time together, it seemed for a short time, that Miss Liebelt was giving more of a science lesson than a chapel service. She was sharing facts about the sun and the moon. Some were surprised to hear that even though we clearly see the moon and enjoy moonlight, it is actually a dark mass that doesn't generate its own light. She explained we have moonlight because it receives and reflects the light of the sun. She then explained our Christian belief, that by ourselves we can't earn forgiveness or generate God's love for others on our own.


On Sunday, our Lutheran churches celebrated the first church reformation. It's a time when we particularly remember the bible passage:

This year, with all its unique challenges, I am so grateful for the amazing care, nurture and learning for our students. All our staff are a blessing in the lives of our students and community.

School Council News

At our October meeting, we considered the first draft of our 2021 school budget. It is a budget that reflects the complexities of funding for schools and the challenge of making best use of our resources. While the 2021 budget won't be finalised until our November meeting, School Council did commit to maintaining our class structures and staffing levels.

School Council is acutely aware of the financial challenges and uncertainty that exists for a number of families in our COVID normal environment. With this in mind, we have limited the necessary tuition fee increase to the lowest level in over a decade at 2% and have not made any increases to our levies.

Payment Plans

We are working through a number of options to simplify our billing process. One of these options includes a portal that enables you to setup and manage your own payment plan and welcome your feedback on this. We are aware Cornerstone have adopted a similar approach. If you are using this, we are especially interested in your feedback on how this would work at St Mark's.

School Council remains committed to continue to support families impacted financially by COVID-19 and economic impacts and asks that you please contact me to discuss support options.

The 2021 Fee Schedule

1st child \$890.00 per term or \$3560 p/a 2nd child \$777.50 per term or \$3110 p/a 3rd child \$665.00 per term or \$2660 p/a 4th and subsequent children unchanged at \$62.50 per term or \$250 per annum.

This represents an increase of \$72 per year for each of the first three children in each family.

The tuition fee includes co-curricular activities such as classroom consumables, excursions, swimming, dance and gymnastics programs etc. Camps, stationery and optional activities such as chess club, scholastic book club, instrument lessons and hire and school photographs are invoiced separately on an at cost basis.

Capital Levy remains unchanged at \$250 per family per year.

IT Levy remains unchanged at \$125 per child per year.

All sibling discounts, school card discount and rebates remain unchanged.

Once our budget has been finalised by School Council I'll be able to share the initiatives that we plan to deliver in 2021 for the benefit of our students.

2021 Stationery Orders

After the less than satisfactory performance of the online stationery ordering system we used for 2020, I can advise we have sourced a new supplier who has greater local connections and an understanding of the standard we require.

Adelaide Direct Stationers (ADS) will be providing the service this year and you will shortly receive details on the ordering process and timelines.

We look forward to a much improved service completed on time as ADS uses their own courier delivery service.

Year 6 News

Last week, the Year 6 classes worked together to perform various science experiments.



The purpose of the demonstration was for students to observe and record the changes in certain materials as they were physically or chemically altered in some way. They used heat, combined ingredients, and applied some physical changes (shaking items) to observe how they would change.

By recording these changes they could work out if the changes were reversible or irreversible, chemical or physical.



Students were able to use their observations to classify each demonstration of change.
