Thank you for your interest in the classroom teaching position we have available at St Mark's. The position is a fixed term position commencing on Monday, 11th October 2021 until the end of Term Four, Friday 10th December 2021. The position is teaching one of our two Year 3 classes replacing a teacher on long service leave.

St Mark's Lutheran School was established in 1982 by the St Mark's Lutheran Church in Mount Barker to provide quality Christian education to our community. From small beginnings we have grown to a current enrolment of 316 students. We are community minded and are seeking a passionate educator who has students front and centre, is a learner and collaborator.

Learning at St Mark's is framed by our 6 learning principles which have been collaboratively developed by staff. At St Mark's:

1. Learning conceptually through inquiry, focussing on critical and creative thinking, promotes deep understanding, connections and transference of knowledge.
2. Learning in an environment that is safe, respectful and nurturing promotes confidence, positive risk taking and improved learning outcomes.
3. Learning opportunities that cater for the different learning styles and abilities of students enhance progress towards excellence for all students.
4. Learning that is developed from regular assessment and feedback to learners provides challenge and engagement for all students.
5. Learning that connects with student's backgrounds, perspectives and interests promote self-motivation and authentic engagement.
6. Learning that builds essential capabilities while embedding technology as a tool for learning equips students to be able to redefine their understandings, respond to issues and be life-long learners.

The successful applicant will demonstrate the ability to maintain the standards of teaching and learning in our school, reflecting our learning principles, and be able to make a positive contribution as a collaborator and member of our staff team.

Quality teaching at St Mark's aligns with the three domains of *Professional knowledge*, *Professional practice* and *Professional engagement* as described in the AITSL teaching standards.
