Faith Focus

Let's Eat! On Sunday, Pastor shared the following...

Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, looked up toward heaven, and blessed them. Then, breaking the loaves into pieces, he kept giving the bread and fish to the disciples so they could distribute it to the people.

Luke 9:16

The story in Luke 9:12-17 is often called The Feeding of the 5,000, though, in fact, the total number of people fed was much larger, since the 5,000 only identifies the number of men present. The plot of the story is simple. Thousands of people gathered in a remote place where Jesus was teaching and healing them. When it came time for the evening meal, there was nothing for people to eat, other than five loaves of bread and two fish donated by a small boy. From these however, Jesus was able to provide ample food for the whole crowd. He miraculously multiplied the quantity of food so that everyone was well fed and there were twelve baskets of leftovers.

Feeding the hungry is an act of compassion. Throughout the centuries, Christians have followed the lead of Jesus in seeking to feed people... especially those with limited access to food. At St Mark's we often host events that provide for those less fortunate within our local and global community or even for those in our own school community facing a difficult time – we do this through walk-a-thons, the collection of non-perishable food items for Hungry No More, weekly Chapel offerings for the Seeds of Hope program as well as other charities. There's also the Whispers of Hope program, where our St Mark's school families volunteer to support other families in need.

The feeding of 5000 also serves as an encouragement to all of us who care for our own families through the preparation of school lunches and evening meals! Through our efforts to care for the needs of our children, partners and extended family, we are following in the steps of our Lord Jesus – forever feeding and nurturing.

As you travel through your week, I invite you to give thanks for the blessing of all those in our community, who in their compassion and care for others, are the hands and feet of our Lord Jesus in this world.

Daily Practices

I spent last Thursday and Friday in a retreat style environment with nearly 30 Principals and Leaders from Lutheran Schools and Kindys in SA, NT and WA. We had time to reflect and check in where we are up to with God, as well as engage in wellbeing sessions led by Madhavi Nawana Parker from Positive Minds Australia. She shared practical strategies to improve and maintain wellbeing during the times of pressure, tensions, challenge and stress that we all experience to varying degrees.

At assembly on Tuesday morning our Year 6 students shared some of the strategies they are learning through our YCDI (You Can Do It) program. They showed us how to deal with the 'monkey on our brain.' Our YCDI and Circle time activities are regular features of our classroom time.

Wellbeing, quite rightly, is a constant topic of conversation. There are times when



significant support is needed, but often, quite simple habits and practices of the mind have been shown to make a positive difference to wellbeing. My generation never really learnt about grounding

practices such as breathing, checking in, reflective journalling, practising daily gratitude etc. I'm pleased to have discovered these and even more pleased we can introduce them to our students.

I look forward to welcoming parents to our education session on cyber safety. Thank you in anticipation for helping us support our families in keeping our students safe in the digital world.


