# Faith Focus

## The Rock - Our Rock

In the forever changing landscape of the world today, where information and opinions from billboards, television, social media (and even school newsletters) flood our senses, finding a solid foundation for our faith and beliefs are essential. How else can we know what is right? How can we know what is wrong? Where do we go to find the truths of a life really worth living – a life so worthy, so richly blessed that our own children want to shadow our footsteps?

In Matthew 16:13-20, Jesus presents a profound revelation to His disciples, a revelation that not only shaped the early Christian Church but also holds a powerful message for us today.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But what about you?' he asked. 'Who do you say I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven.'"

Matthew 16:13-17 NIV

These precious words describe a pivotal moment in the disciples' journey with Jesus. He takes them to Caesarea Philippi, a place of pagan worship, and poses a crucial question: "Who do you say I am?" Peter's response, "Yow are the Messiah, the Son of the living God," is not merely a well-thought-out answer, but a revelation from God Himself. Jesus identifies this revelation as the foundation upon which He will build His Church—a rock solid enough to withstand the storms of time (Matthew 16:18).

The significance of this passage reaches far beyond its historical context. Just as the disciples grappled with the question of Jesus' identity, we too are faced with a barrage of ideologies, worldviews, and voices vying for our attention. In a world of uncertainty, the confession Peter made remains the bedrock of our faith—the revelation that Jesus is the Son of God.

Jesus continues to be the unchanging foundation upon which we can build our lives, that is why He is called The rock. He guides our decision-making, shapes our values, and provides hope amid challenges. When we place our identity in Jesus, we find purpose that transcends fleeting trends and societal pressures. Without him, I'd simply have nowhere to hang my hat!

As you travel through your week, I invite you to ponder the words of Matthew...consider Jesus as the rock – solid enough to withstand all of life's challenges... and when all is travelling well... I invite you to find a moment to give thanks to a God whose love for us is never-ending.



### St Mark's Lutheran School Council Nominations

Nominations for four (4) positions on the St Mark's Lutheran School Council are now open.

School Council holds governance responsibility for St Mark's Lutheran School. It comprises up to eight members including:

- at least six members required to be members of the St Mark's Lutheran church or another Lutheran Church
- up to two members who are practicing Christians from the school or wider community.

The four positions open for nomination are for a two-year term (minimum three Lutheran members with one able to be a practicing Christian member). Current School Council members completing their two year term are able to re-nominate.

School Council membership is voluntary and requires members to meet once a month during the school year, with some out of session activities from time to time.

Applicants will ideally have experience in one of the following areas: financial management, risk management, information technology, education, facilities and master planning. These skills will complement School Council's current skills profile.

School Council membership is elected by members of the St Mark's Lutheran Church Mt Barker, in their role as Members of the School, at an Annual Election Meeting in November. Elections are based on recommendation from School Council.
