# Faith Focus

# You Are Special!

Max Lucado's picture book'You Are Special' remains one of my all-time favourites. In the story, the Wemmicks live in a world where they constantly judge each other, placing either golden stars or black dots on each other based on their perceptions of worth. We might be able to relate to this.... humans also judge and label others based on their appearance, talents, or social status. However, Lucado presents the story that God views each of us differently. He sees beyond our imperfections and recognises each of our unique gifts and talents.

In 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 we read...

"There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone, it is the same God at work. Now to each one, the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good."

In 1 Corinthians 12, the Apostle Paul reminds us that God has given us different kinds of gifts and talents through the Holy Spirit. These gifts are not meant to be compared or ranked as they are equally important for the common good. Just as in Lucado's story, where each Wemmick is special regardless of their stars or dots, we are all special in God's eyes because of the gifts He has given us.

There may be times when we might struggle with self-esteem and self-worth, forgetting that we are fearfully and wonderfully made by our Creator. At these times I invite you to remain focused on your uniqueness... your talents and abilities... each designed to serve a greater purpose. Instead of trying to fit into society's mold or seeking validation from others, use your God-given gifts to bless those around you. AND by blessing others – AND trust me on this one - most struggles will seem less consuming.

Your gifts do not need to be anything grandiose. Your gift might just be a word of encouragement for a child, parent, friend or stranger in need. Your gift might just be a warm smile. Never under-estimate the power of the simplest kind word or action... the gift of a kind word or action has the potential to alter the trajectory of another's day or even life!

Next week as our Junior Primary students present the musical "You Are Special", let us remember that each person is a unique creation of God, each blessed with special gifts and talents. Just as Eli loved the Wemmicks unconditionally, God loves us despite our flaws and imperfections. It is our privilege and responsibility to share our God given gifts with others for the good of all people – big or small!

The races are varied in length to account for different ages and will be held in in the following order:


1st Race - Year 2

# St Mark's Lutheran School Council Nominations

Nominations for four (4) positions on the St Mark's Lutheran School Council are now open.

School Council holds governance responsibility for St Mark's Lutheran School. It comprises up to eight members including:

- at least six members required to be members of the St Mark's Lutheran church or another Lutheran Church
- up to two members who are practicing Christians from the school or wider community.

The four positions open for nomination are for a two-year term (minimum three Lutheran members with one able to be a practicing Christian member). Current School Council members completing their two year term are able to re-nominate.

School Council membership is voluntary and requires members to meet once a month during the school year, with some out of session activities from time to time.

Applicants will ideally have experience in one of the following areas: financial management, risk management, information technology, education, facilities and master planning. These skills will complement School Council's current skills profile.

School Council membership is elected by members of the St Mark's Lutheran Church Mt Barker, in their role as Members of the School, at an Annual Election Meeting in November. Elections are based on recommendation from School Council.
