Faith Focus

This Sunday is Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, a significant time for Christians worldwide. It commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where crowds welcomed Him with palm branches and shouts of "Hosanna!" Yet, within a week, the same crowds would cry out for His crucifixion. Joy and tragedy... a little like the highs and lows we experience in our own daily lives....

In Matthew we read of the triumphant entry of Jesus to Jerusalem (Matthew 21:1-11) where he was greeted amidst cheers and praises... is this not similar to our own moments of triumph and success?....Our children eating all of their vegetables at the dinner table with not even one complaint, a 14 year old son using words (I understand) rather than the usual grunt, a three year old finally mastering potty training ... aren't all of these momentus gifts from God? They certainly are and were for me!

We hear Jesus being confronted by corruption in the temple (*Matthew 21:12-17*). Yet he demonstrated the courage to stand against injustice. Similarly, we encounter challenges and temptations that test our faith... Let us draw strength from Jesus' example and confront these obstacles with just hearts.

In the garden of Gethsemane (*Matthew 26:36-46*), Jesus grappled with the weight of His impending sacrifice, yet He surrendered to God's will. Likewise, we face moments of uncertainty and fear. Through prayer and trust in God's plan, we can find the strength to persevere and continue the journey... whatever the journey may be.

At the last supper Jesus endured betrayal from Judas and denial from Peter (Matthew 26:47-75), experiencing the sting of abandonment. How often in our own lives do we encounter betrayal and rejection?... What are your memories of being left out of a game at school or called terrible names by children who you thought were friends? You may not have suffered these experiences but I'm sure there were others. I encourage you to remember that Jesus understands our pain and stands with us in our very darkest moments.

Then Jesus bore the weight of the cross all the way to Calvary (*Matthew 27:32-56*) enduring ridicule and suffering along the way. Similarly, we carry our own burdens and face hardships in our journey. Yet, just as Jesus conquered death, we find hope in His victory over sin and death.

And finally... Jesus' crucifixion (*Matthew 27:57-28:10*) seemed like the end, but it certainly wasn't the end. His resurrection brought forth new life and redemption. Likewise, in our trials and struggles, we find hope in the promise of resurrection and the assurance of God's unfailing love for us all.

As we reflect on Palm Sunday and the events of Holy Week, I invite you to remember that our journey mirrors that of Jesus. Through triumphs and trials, let us remain steadfast in faith, knowing that He walks alongside us every step of the way. As we embrace the paradox of the cross, may we find strength, hope and a peace that only the resurrection of Jesus can bring.

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (1 Corinthians 1:18)

CAMP QUALITY'S CANCER EDUCATION PROGRAM HAS BEEN BOOKED TO VISIT YOUR PRIMARY OR PRESCHOOL. WE CAN'T WAIT TO SEE YOU!

Camp Quality's cancer education program has been teaching kids about cancer with a fun and interactive puppet performance, for over 33 years. The program focuses on telling the broader cancer story, including how to support someone who is facing their own cancer diagnosis or that of a loved one.

The free Cancer Education Program visits primary and preschools around Australia and is shown to reduce bullying, absenteeism and the need for mental health support services for kids impacted by cancer. An independent KMPG report showed the total Social Return on Investment of the Cancer Education Program is \$5 for every \$1 spent.

The program includes newly developed Teacher Resource Packs aligned to the Australian Curriculum, Early Years Learning Framework and state-based curriculums. **Teacher lesson plans, classroom activities and our Talking About Cancer guide** provide further learning on the social and emotional impacts of cancer. We also offer a free Kids' Guide to Cancer App that can be downloaded to your smartphone or tablet. Our resources have been developed in consultation with subject matter experts in the health and education sectors and help to facilitate conversations about cancer.

Only, Ariel can't go... how will she ever explain to the other kids why she doesn't have any hair, and why she's tired and skinny...? The Big Party by Julianne O'Brien is an empowering story, using interactive puppetry to teach us about cancer and the importance of positivity and recognising our own strengths.

Will Ariel ever make it through Year 5, and will Tom ever become a soccer superstar? The Big Score by Julianne O'Brien is a touching story, using interactive puppetry to teach us about cancer and the importance of hope and acceptance.
