# Faith Focus

I use the Our Daily Bread resource for my daily devotion. It's convenient because it's available for free both online (<a href="https://odb.org/">https://odb.org/</a>) or in a little hard copy booklet.

My devotion on Good Friday was as follows:

A wealthy twenty-year-old was drag-racing with his friends when he struck and killed a pedestrian. Although the young man received a three-year prison sentence, some believe that the man who appeared in court (and who subsequently served a prison sentence) was a hired surrogate for the driver who committed the crime. This type of thing has been known to occur in some countries where people hire body doubles to avoid paying for their crimes.

This may sound scandalous and outrageous, but more than two thousand years ago, Jesus became our substitute and "suffered once for [our] sins, the righteous for the unrighteous" (1 Peter 3:18). As God's sinless sacrifice, Christ suffered and died once and for all (Hebrews 10:10), for all who believe in Him. He took the penalty for all our sins in His own body on the cross. Unlike a person today who chooses to be a substitute for a criminal to get some cash, Christ's substitutionary death on the cross provided "hope" for us as He freely, willingly gave His life for us (1 Peter 3:15, 18; John 10:15).

While on the one hand this reminded me of the amazing, generous, unconditional, loving, self-sacrificing gift that Jesus gave me when he died on the cross for me, on the other hand it pointed out to me something else quite profound and unexpected. That is, while the vast majority of the world's population are locked into a currency based on money (or other capital items), power, and violence, Jesus has an entirely different currency – Jesus deals in love, peace, and hope.

Like, in the example above, the rich young man used his wealth to buy his own freedom and avoid what he deserved – the consequences of his illegal and deadly activities. Other people use their power, and yet other people use violence to achieve their desired outcomes.

Instead, Jesus voluntarily endured consequences he did not deserve to buy our freedom. And he did that before we'd even committed our offences! In love he gave of himself in order that we might have peace and hope.

It seems to me our world could do with a whole lot more love, peace, and hope right now. It seems to me our world could do with a whole lot more Jesus right now! If you haven't before, I encourage you to check him out.
