# Faith Focus

### THE INVISIBLE GOD

A highlight of my role at St Mark's is the opportunity to get to know students and chat about many interesting topics as they arise. Recently during devotion time, a foundation student leant over to me and whispered, "I can't see God". Slightly amused I whispered back "God is invisible, we can't see Him, but He is everywhere, and He can see us!" Her eyes widened as she looked around and I could just see the cogs turning!

Believing in a God we can't see may seem like blind faith however the Bible tells a different story...

*Romans 1:20 "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse."* 

The Bible explains that God HAS provided evidence. Just as a painting bears witness of a painter; creation bears witness to a divine creator. We may not see God directly, but we do indirectly through His handiwork.

#### Psalm 19:1 "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands".

Over the Easter weekend, our focus was firmly on Jesus and his death on the cross. The allpowerful, all-knowing creator became human. He forgave sins, fulfilled prophecy, and performed incredible miracles amongst crowds of witnesses again and again to provide evidence to a sceptical world, and by his death made the way possible for our reconciliation.

John 1:10 "He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. 11 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. 12 But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God."

Ours is not a blind faith, but a firm faith!
