God reminds us "Be still and know that I am God". Sometimes, we keep running around with so much to do, and so many people depend on us to do things. We forget that we can just take a moment and hit 'pause'. No, the world will not collapse or spin out of control.

I pray we find that moment each day, to be still and know that God is God and we do not need to be.



Small grant available for drought affected students

We have been notified of a small grant (up to \$750) available for students who are directly affected by the drought. The grant (paid by the Federal Government) must be allocated to school fees. The set of criteria is as follows:

- Student attends a South Australian Independent school which has an ARIA of 0.2 or greater (St Mark's Lutheran School has been identified as meeting this criteria);
- Student is enrolled at the school and in a year level for which the school is eligible for Australian Government recurrent funding (Reception to Year 12) and has a regular pattern of attendance at the school;
- Family is experiencing financial distress as a direct result of drought in South Australia;
- Principal place of the student's family residence is located in South Australia and outside of the township; and
- Student's family meets the assessment criteria for School Card as the government school rate.

If you are not eligible for School Card, however can prove a significant change in circumstance (directly related to the drought), you may be eligible for this funding.

Please contact our Business Manager <u>cschmarr@stmarks.sa.edu.au</u>) if you feel that your student is eligible, and the school will apply on your behalf.
