Before last week's game, I asked the players to start their journal with something a little different... '**Why** do you love footy?' A myriad of responses were written but the most impacting response was the physical one I noted as players were recording their responses and then the excited chatter as they shared their **why** with their teammates.

The **why**; it's so important. If you don't know **why** you're doing something, you lose sight of the bigger purpose.
