

I had the privilege of travelling to Perth in late July, to attend the National Graduate Show. It is an annual event run by the Perth Institute of Contemporary Art and showcases one Visual Arts' graduate from each university in Australia. I was there to support my daughter, who had been selected for the exhibition, representing Flinders University.

It was wonderful to view the work of the 23 exhibiting artists, to see their creativity, their courage, and their commitment. One artwork in particular caught my curiosity. A young woman from the University of Sydney had constructed an Aeolian harp and mounted it over a window. This type of harp is an ancient instrument and is comprised of 10 strings, all of the same length and thickness and mounted with the same tension. The harp is designed to be set in such a position that it is 'played' by the wind. In so doing the 'invisible' (the wind) is made 'visible' (through the sound).

In my contemplations I couldn't but think of the 'invisible' nature of the Spirit of God, sometimes described as being like the wind, and that this harp somehow was capturing and making 'visible' the presence God in his creation... the sound coming from that harp, there in Perth, was like a whisper from God.

Praise God for his presence with us each day. May we resonate to His love. Whether we can see it or not, God is here, and there, and everywhere.

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. Year 4 Excursion






