

Growing up on a farm where we grew wheat and raised sheep for wool, shearing time, was an exciting annual event. The day before the shearers arrived, my siblings and I would help Dad round up the sheep in the paddocks and get them to the shearing shed. We would help Mum with preparing hearty meals and copious amounts of cake and tea for the shearers. My main job each day was to stay out of everyone's way until the outside small yards were full. Then, I picked up the metal branding stamp, which was a capital A inside a circle, a tin of purple wool paint, and head out to the freshly shorn sheep. I had to stamp each sheep with the paint-laden brand on the right rump. Not an easy job when the sheep would never stand still, and I only had one chance to get it right each time.

The purpose of the paint brand was to identify each sheep as belonging to our farm because sometimes during the year, a few sheep would find a way to get through the fence into the neighbours' paddocks. Each year after the lambs were born, the farmers would check their sheep, and if there were strays, they would be returned to the right farmer according to the brand on their rump.

Thankfully, we are not marked in the same way as sheep, but as Christians, we bear the name of Christ. However, it is not just by the name of Christ that we are known, but by our actions, how we treat each other.

In John 13:35, Jesus says:

By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.

Jesus was teaching his disciples during the Last Supper, when he gave them a new commandment to "love one another as I have loved you".

Lord, help us to reflect your love to those we meet and in all that we do. For your name's sake, Amen.

Each day at St Marks, as we see our students as capable and competent, we'll be encouraging them to take one more step to grow into their best versions of themselves.


Thank you again to our P&F team and volunteers. Last Saturday's discos and today's Father's Day stall have both enriched our students and community experiences.
