

### What is the Lord's Prayer?

Every Friday at Chapel, we pray this thing called the Lord's Prayer.

Have you ever asked yourself "Why?" or maybe "What is the Lord's Prayer, anyway?"

Well! I'm glad you asked! 😊

The Lord's Prayer is a prayer given to us by Jesus himself (hence its name!). The Bible (Luke 11:1-4; Matthew 9:9-13) tells us that one day Jesus was praying when one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray," and Jesus recited what we now know as the Lord's Prayer.

When Jesus gave his disciples this prayer, though, he wasn't teaching them what to say, he was teaching them HOW to pray. That is, we can use whatever words we like, but Jesus gives us an example of a pattern of prayer, and some pointers as to what to keep in mind when we pray to God.

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name ..." reminds us that God invites us to address him as our dear heavenly Father, as we acknowledge that he is the one and only true holy and powerful yet loving God, and we ask him to help us always keep his name holy.

"... your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" recognises that, through faith, we are part of God's kingdom, and he empowers us to talk about and share his love so that everyone on earth has the opportunity to get to know him and also become a member of his kingdom.

"Give us today our daily bread" acknowledges God created the world, and he continues to sustain the world, including us! We may not have all we want, but he gives us what we need every day.

"Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us" confesses that we struggle to always live God's way. We hurt him and we hurt (and get hurt by) the people around us. But God gives us the power to forgive others, and he forgives us, because of what Jesus did for us on the cross.

"Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" reminds us that we are surrounded by forces that would love to distract us from God. Here we pray for God to help us maintain our focus on him. AMEN!

In conclusion, the Olympiads are dedicated to improving their problem solving and maths skills, and they are enjoying the food.


