My husband and I live in one of three adjoining properties in Bridgewater. We are in the process of seeking "Community Title" for the properties and we are working through the bureaucracy and paperwork that that involves. The three adjoining blocks centre around half an acre of native vegetation, plus an established orchard and vegetable garden, which is a lot of work to maintain on our own! Community title will protect the area from development in the future and preserve a unique piece of bushland that can be shared. Our main motivation is not just to reduce the mowing; we also want to build an intentional community. We are aware that, more and more, the trend in our society is towards a lifestyle that focuses on self and leaves many people feeling isolated and alone. Community title will mean that the three households will share in the upkeep of the native vegetation, orchard and vegetable garden, and in the produce it provides. There will be regular times spent caring for the land together, working alongside one another, jointly investing in the beautiful creation God has given us to call home. The desire is that this little community will also gather to share meals, to support one another, to live out our faith in Jesus, and to intentionally slow down with a warm welcome to others who come to visit.

God has made us to live in relationship. The triune nature of God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and his determination to join us in our humanity, is all testament to the relational nature of our God. And we are made in his image! We were not made to live in isolation, in disconnect from each other and from the environment.

In Hebrews 10:24-25 we read, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another..." And in Romans 12 we are encouraged to... "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves..... Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality."

There are many different ways to slow down and connect with others. In tiny moments of encounter or interaction, even jobs shared, we can let others know that they are part of God's creation and that we all belong.

Friday Chapel


Chapel is held every Friday at 9am in the Hall. We look forward to Foundation H leading us in Chapel tomorrow.
